All Survivors Project (ASP) Privacy Policy sits within a set of Core Values which inform all of ASP's work and within which it operates. The Policy should also be read in conjunction with all other ASP policies.

1. ASP's core values

ASP is committed to the following core values:

- Human-rights centred: ASP's work is guided by international human rights and humanitarian norms and standards, centring the agency, autonomy, dignity and safety of all survivors of conflict-related sexual violence (CRSV), and principles of non-discrimination and self-determination.
- Survivor-centred: ASP recognises survivors as experts and centres their leadership, agency and lived experience. ASP works in partnership with survivors wherever possible to inform its research and action, ensuring that their voices, expertise and self-determined priorities guide all efforts to end and respond to CRSV.
- Ethical and accountable: ASP upholds ethical approaches in its research, advocacy and other activities, and is committed to being accountable to the victims/survivors and partners with whom it works, and to organizations working to prevent and respond to CRSV against women and girls.
- Independent, impartial and neutral: To protect its independence, ASP ensures that all its funding is consistent with its mission and values. ASP acts with impartiality, conducting its work without discrimination. ASP maintains its neutrality by not taking sides in armed conflicts or hostilities.

2. Purpose and scope

This Privacy Policy outlines how ASP collects, uses, stores, and protects personal information in the course of its general organisational operations and activities. It applies to all personal data processed by the organisation, including information relating to members of staff, consultants, contractors, volunteers and representatives of ASP partners, donors, beneficiaries, website visitors, and other stakeholders with whom ASP engages in its day-to-day work. The policy sets out ASP commitment to protecting individual privacy rights, ensuring compliance with applicable data protection UK and Liechtenstein laws, and maintaining transparency about our data handling practices across all operational functions such as human resources, communications, fundraising, program implementation, and partnership management.

This Privacy Policy specifically does not cover the collection, use, and protection of personal data gathered for research purposes. Research activities, including data collected from research participants, surveys, studies, and evaluations, are governed by separate policies that addresses the unique ethical considerations, informed consent requirements, and specialised safeguards applicable to research contexts. Where research activities intersect with general organisational operations, all policies may apply, and the more stringent protections will prevail to ensure comprehensive privacy safeguards.

3. Disclosure of information

ASP will not share, sell, or otherwise disclose any individual's personal information to any third party unrelated to ASP, other than where the law requires or where ASP has sought and been given the individual's specific informed consent to do so.

4. What information ASP collects and how it is used

ASP collects and retains information any individual voluntarily submits to the organisation through ASP newsletter subscription form and/or by contacting ASP via email.

If an individual subscribes to ASP newsletter, ASP collects the individual's email address, their name, and other personal data. Mailchimp, the third-party software we use to manage our e-mail lists, may gather other data, which is governed by their own data protection



policies. If any individual wishes to unsubscribe from our newsletter, they may do so by clicking "unsubscribe" in any edition that they have received.

ASP may also use an individual's data to offer services, effectively operate our website (via use of cookies), manage their inquiries, subscriptions, donations and other interactions with them. ASP may request personal data in forms not mentioned in this policy, such as when an individual volunteers, registers for an ASP event, visits our website, or applies for employment.

If an individual submits personal information when contacting ASP, it will be read by a staff member or collaborator, and may be shared with other members of ASP team. It will be retained for 12 months unless the individual requests us to delete it.

5. Use of cookies

ASP uses cookies (small text files) that the ASP website may place on any individual's computer as a tool to remember the person's preferences. Anybody may refuse the use of cookies by selecting the appropriate settings on their browser. Some cookies on ASP website are essential, and ASP website will not work as expected without them. These cookies are set when any person submits a form or interacts with the site by doing something that goes beyond clicking on a link. ASP also uses some non-essential cookies to anonymously track visitors or enhance visitors' experience of ASP website, including through Google Analytics. For information on how Google Analytics may collect individual data, Google's privacy policy can be consulted. Details of the cookies used by Google Analytics are available here.

6. Third parties' websites

ASP website site contains links to other websites. These links are provided for visitors' convenience; ASP has no control over such websites, nor is it responsible for their content. ASP's Privacy Policy does not extend to any websites that can be accessed from the ASP website https://allsurvivorsproject.org or any related websites within the domain of https://allsurvivorsproject.org. The inclusion of these links on the ASP website does not imply endorsement of any material on those websites, or any association with their operators, unless otherwise stated. ASP cannot guarantee the security of these sites, the operation of the links or that they will be virus-free.

7. Social media

ASP uses social media and social networking services (Instagram, LinkedIN, Facebook and BlueSky) to advance its work. These services have their own privacy and cookie policies. ASP is not responsible for the way these companies may use individuals' personal data.

8. Acceptance of our Privacy Policy

By using ASP website and/or submitting individual information to ASP, any person consents to ASP keeping and using such information in the manner described in this Privacy Policy. ASP aim is to ensure that all personal details are current, accurate and complete.

9. Data subjects' rights

Any person may choose to request, correct, update or delete the information they have provided to ASP. Anybody has a right to see the information ASP holds about them at any time and ASP will correct it if it is inaccurate, provided ASP is notified accordingly. 10. Notification of change of Privacy Policy

ASP reserves the right to amend this Privacy Policy at any time. Should this happen, ASP will post the revised policy on the ASP website.

11. Applicable law

As ASP is based in the United Kingdom and Liechtenstein, ASP complies with UK and Liechtenstein data protection legislation currently in force.
